FUTURE VENTURES:

TRIUMF

We hope to arrange a visit in early April to the TRIUMF Cyclotron facility on the UBC campus. This facility provides world-leading facilities for experiments in subatomic research with beams of pions, muons, protons and neutrons. Of course, the function of the Cyclotron is to accelerate an H-minus ion beam, from 300 KeV to a maximum of 520 MeV in order to extract simultaneous proton beams at various energies and currents, into numerous beamlines, for delivery to targets for the designated experiments.

Who knows, perhaps after the visit we may

be able to understand just what this means! More details later.

A., KARIM OAYUMI, MD, PhD, FRCSC

Dr. Qayumi is a Professor of Surgery and Director of the UBC Centre of Excellence for Surgical Education and Innovation. Director of Research for the Divisions of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery, Program Director of the Centre for Excellence Transplant Biology Unit at the BC Transplant Society and Director of Phase VI for Medical Curriculum at the University of BC.

Dr. Qayumi is a veteran investigator and an outstanding teacher at the University of British Columbia. He has extensive international teaching experience with excellent records.

In 1999 he received the most prestigious award from the University of British Columbia - Kiliam Teaching Prize as an outstanding teacher.

Dr. Qayumi has developed numerous curriculums for the University of British Columbia and internationally.

Dr. Qayum has written a book on basic surgical techniques accompanied with a CD-ROM. This book has more that 500 colour illustrations and the CD-ROM has more than 100 animations. This book received the best author award in 1999 at the UBC Author's Competition.

Dr. Qayumi is the founder of the artificially intelligent Interactive multimedia software called "CyberPatient™" and has the leadership in the development of this product.

He is the founder and program director of the B.C. Institute for Afghan Studies and the founder and director of the Partnership Afghanistan, a non-profit organization assisting in the reconstruction of Afghanistan. Dr. Qayumi has designed a health care system for rural Afghanistan that will greatly improve the livelihood in the rural areas of Afghanistan. In June 2003 Dr. Qayumi visited his motherland after 23 years to plant seeds for implementation of his health care program.
