#### MICHAEL KLUCKNER



Michael Kluckner is a writer and artist whose early books on the history of Canadian cities, heritage, planning issues and art include Vancouver The Way It Was, Paving Paradise

and British Columbia in Watercolour. These books won numerous awards including the Duthie Prize, the Vancouver Book Prize, the Toronto Book Prize (short list), the Hallmark Society (Victoria) Award of Merit and the Heritage Canada Medal of Achievement. His remarkable contribution to heritage preservation and Canadian culture was further recognized in 2002 when Michael was presented with the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal for outstanding achievement. His most recent book Vanishing British Columbia was published by U.B.C. Press.

In addition to his work as a writer and artist Michael was the founding president of the Heritage Vancouver Society and has served on the boards of the Heritage Society of British Columbia and the Heritage Canada Foundation.

Michael and his wife, author Christine Allen, live on a farm with a large cottage and garden in rural Langley.

#### JOHN ATKIN

John Atkin has acted as our tour guide on

**Probus** walking tours in recent years. John knows Vancouver like few others and can be



counted on to offer interesting and offbeat insights into the city's architecture, history and neighbourhoods.

In addition to his tour business, Vancouver Walks, John presents a popular Continuing Studies course at U.B.C. called <u>Neighbourhoods Explained</u> plus being frequently interviewed on local radio and television shows. John is also editor of the *Journal of British Columbia History*. His books include *Strathcona: Vancouver's First Neighbourhood* and *Vancouver Walks*, which has been co-authored with Michael Kluckner. This popular guidebook is now in its second printing! John's new guidebook, *Skytrain Explorer*, describes walks from each of the Expo Line Stations between Vancouver and New Westminster.

John and his wife Robin live in a heritage home in Strathcona.

## Minutes of the June 14th Meeting

Attendance: 130 including 1 guests

President Gordon called the meeting to order at 10:00am. He regretfully announced the passing of Paul Kepkay, Bill Mitchell and Peter McCabe.

John Hoyle introduced new members: Walter Badun, John Pearkes and Robert Kennedy.

Committee Reports: Treasurer **Bill Manson** gave his usual report...silence! Probus Canada Director **Pidge McBride** had nothing new to report. **Bill Adams** covered the following events; Princess Lousia Tour attracted 23 persons; Steveston Village Tour all set to go with 27 registered; Bard on the Beach set for August 6th and Probus Football Night is slated for October 1st.

**Gordon Christopher** introduced our guest speaker Fred McMahon of the Fraser Institute who spoke on the Promotion of Economic Freedom in the Arab World.

Economic Freedom promotes other freedoms and democracy by liberating people and families from dependence on government and by building prosperity, which in turn reinforces the movement towards freedom and democracy. Economic freedom includes the key ingredients of personal choice, protection of personal property, voluntary exchange and the freedom to compete.

To attain economic freedom it is necessary for a

country to have satisfactory governance, a sound legal structure and security of property rights, access to sound money, freedom to trade internationally, and regulation of credit, labour and business. The Fraser Institute, helped by a \$500,000.00 grant from the John Templeton Foundation, has attempted to create an index based on these factors in order to rank the level of economic freedom in Arab countries. Due to lack of data from some countries it has not been possible to assess all.

The speaker then presented the rankings of 16 Arab States in various parameters based on the developed indices. For instance the overall economic freedom rankings showed that: the Gulf States: Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the UAR ranked highest. The relatively peaceful states were next: Yemen, Jordan, Mauritania, Tunisia, Egypt, and Morocco. The conflict states: Syria, Lebanon, Libya and Algeria ranked last.

He then proceeded to present graphs demonstrating the rankings based on size of government, sound money, etc. as well as an overall score of the 16 countries with Kuwait at the top and Algeria at the bottom.

It is the opinion of many that the essential ingredient to the attainment of democracy worldwide is the development of economic freedom worldwide. Unfortunately in the Iraq situation George Bush et al have approached it backwards, trying to create democracy first before developing the infrastructure of economic freedom in Iraq.

Answers to questions from the audience:

- Foreign aid usually gives an unsatisfactory outcome for instance it sustains bad governments.
- Islamic religion is friendly to markets. However, it is at least 50 years behind the West in the economic treatment of women.
- Terrorism by the Arab States is insignificant compared to the West's reigns of terror by Hitler and Stalin.
- The Iraq war has been a terrible setback to East-West relations having created lots of anger in the Arab States.

Michael Jacobson thanked the speaker.
