




Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers

Crime Stoppers is a non-profit society and registered charity that receives anonymous tip information about criminal activity and provides it to police and other law enforcement agencies in communities from Powell River to Boston Bar. Information is also provided to a wide variety of other provincial, federal and international agencies. The general public may have information that would assist in police investigations. Some members of the public don't want to get involved with the police. Crime Stoppers provides the opportunity to leave information anonymously. Tipsters are eligible to receive a cash reward up to \$5,000 if their tip leads to an arrest or charge.

Recognizing the large number of languages spoken in Metro Vancouver, Crime Stoppers provides a multilingual translation service. This service helps to solve many cases where information was previously difficult to track down. Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers has been an innovator since its inception and is consistently ranked as one of the most effective Crime Stoppers programs in the world. Since the inception of Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers in 1984, more than half a billion dollars in property and drugs have been recovered and over 8,400 arrests were made as a result of Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers tips.

Common Forms of Elder Abuse

Physical Abuse

- Acts of violence and other ways to coerce elderly victims
- Depriving them of life essentials
- Using medication to incapacitate them
- Locking seniors out of their homes
- Not providing or allowing adequate hygiene

Emotional or psychological abuse

- Withhold basic rights and privileges
- Restricting freedom to socialize with others
- Denying a safe secure environment
- Removing decision-making powers
- Bullying – insults, intimidation, yelling, ignoring and Isolation

Financial abuse

- Withholding funds
- Selling property without the owner's consent
- Forcing elders to alter a will, or abuse power of attorney with intimidation or coercion



Victims of Elder Abuse

Elderly abuse is a subject that is not to be taken lightly. Over 90% of all reported abuse of seniors is committed by someone in their own family. Abuse of elderly people is one of the most underreported crimes in our society. It might go unreported due to embarrassment, fear of retaliation, or an unwillingness to get a family member in trouble. Crime Stoppers wants the public to know there are resources available for victims or if you suspect someone is being neglected or abused.
