## Report of the February 9<sup>th</sup> Meeting

Attendance: 161 Members and Guests

President **Nick Thornton** called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. **Ted Horsey** acted as Secretary.

The President commented on the following items: **Parking; Probus Canada Travel Insurance; Probus BC Conference and the Temporary Moratorium on Applications for Membership.** Details are covered inside the Newsletter.

Five new members were introduced by **Don Newman**. **Bill Sexsmith** announced that the **Fred Cotton** contribution to the establishment and growth of the Club.

**John Cruickshank** outlined the Quest University tour on Tuesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>. Details inside.

Guest Speaker Dr. Larry Goldenberg, introduced by **Bill Sexsmith**, spoke on health concerns and risks. He noted that men are more likely to die from diabetes; 84% more likely from arterial diseases; 70% more likely from heart disease; 29% more likely to be diagnosed with cancer and 40% more likely to die as a result; 80% more likely to have spinal cord injuries, substance abuse, violent and crime involvement; 80% more likely to die from suicide attempts and 90% of workplace deaths.

The more common male health problems chronologically from birth to death are: development disorder, learning disability, autism; congenital anomalies, delayed puberty; testicular cancer; risk taking/MVA, violence, crime, substance abuse, suicide; reproductive life dysfunction, sexual dysfunction, HIV/STI; cardiovascular disease, diabetes, hypertension, obesity, metabolic syndrome; prostatitis; mental health, depression; chronic arthritis, kidney stones, colon cancer; hypo-

gonadism, osteoporosis; prostate cancer, enlarged prostate gland; lack of good health habits.

In Canada, **life expectancy** of women exceeds men by about six years. The gap may be explained by: biological factors (hormonal brain structure); environmental factors (riskier jobs, less social support); behavioral factors (higher risk taking, the masculine role etc.).

Another important statistic to consider is "**health expectancy**", the number of years males can expect to be disability-free and functional dependence free. For men, this averages about ten years less than life expectancy.

Health concerns and risks is promoted by many organizations. The Commonwealth Foundation report of 2000 health concerns and risks.

The World Health Organization Madrid Statement in 2002 stated:

health policies have to recognize that women and men, owing to their biological differences and their gender roles, have different needs, obstacles and opportunities"

The Vienna Declaration of the Health of Men and Boys in 2005 declared that health authorities should: recognize men's health as a distinct and important issue; develop a better understanding on men's attitudes to health; invest in "male sensitive" approaches to providing healthcare; initiate work on health for boys and young men in school and community settings; develop coordinated health and social policies that promote men's health.

"MHIBC") is an "umbrella" initiative of prominent Vancouver physicians and surgeons dedicated solely to the pursuit of excellence in male health. The mandate of the Men's Health Initiative of BC is for: consolidation of local expertise; coordination of clinical, education and research activities; comprehensive research in public and popu-

lation health; central strategy for health promotion, screening aids, risk assessment, disease prevention; communication - social networking, media, website; clinical guidelines and standards of care publication for primary health providers; continuum of care - biopsychosocial - across all ages; community outreach to all socioeconomic groups; collaborate locally, nationally and internationally; creation of government men's health Policy.

It is a large-scale initiative aimed at improving men's health and quality of life through leadership, awareness and education campaigns, research, and disseminating best practices in clinical care. MHIBC has been created in the Department of Urological Sciences, in the Faculty of Medicine of the University of British Columbia in conjunction with the Vancouver General Hospital.

He covered the subjects of impotence, osteoporosis and prostate problems in considerable detail and recommended periodic, comprehensive clinical screening for these conditions.

He mentioned the funding sources for and UBC Hospital Foundation will accept donations and issue tax receipts (Website:<http://www.aboutmen.ca> or phone(604)875-4676).

The supporters of Men's Health Initiative of BC want to seize the opportunity for British Columbia to be a world leader in men's health and in men's well being.

After questions, **Dr. Bill Ibbott** thanked Dr. Goldenberg for his excellent presentation.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

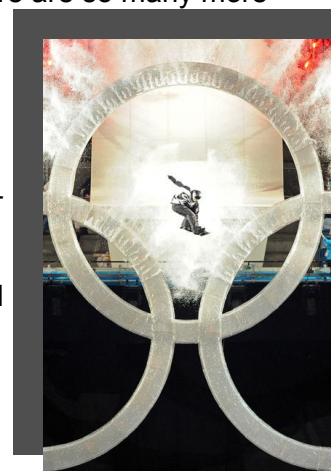
